Dear people of God,

One of Martin Luther's most famous and influential writings was a letter he addressed to Pope Leo X, now known as "The Freedom of a Christian." Written only three years after the 95 The-

ses that sparked the Reformation, it holds themes that echo throughout the rest of Luther's writings. The letter itself is 30 pages long, though Luther offers a handy summary at the beginning:

The Christian individual is a completely free lord of all, subject to none.

The Christian individual is a completely dutiful servant of all, subject to all.

You might be thinking that those are contradictory. Luther admits as much himself, but as he goes on, it becomes clear that they are no more contradictory than the declaration that we are both sinner and saint.

He clarifies: Christians are completely free in regard to sin. Sin does not hold power or authority over a Christian person, so we are free from the heavyhanded legalism that would scrutinize every thought and action for wickedness. It doesn't mean that we stop distinguishing between right and wrong, but that we realize that sin does not get to define us or the people around us.

But, Luther quickly continues, Christians are not completely free from any obligations! No, not at all. The power sin once held over us is replaced, joyfully, with complete, dutiful service to our neighbors.

In other words, our obligation is not to the law (divine or civil), but to our neighbors. Good law can certainly help us serve our neighbors, but obeying the law and serving our neighbors are not necessarily the same thing. We can know complete freedom in our salvation that releases us from sin, even as we know the complete deference that comes with service to our neighbors.

# **Summary June Council Meeting**

**Call to Order:** By President Cullen Stevens at 6:30 pm.

(Note: Motions are shown in the meeting minutes in bold italics.)

Opening prayer by Pastor Beth. In-coming Council members Cindy Tonneson and Jerry Tonneson were welcomed.

May Meeting Minutes: approved by Council.

May Financial Reports: no reports provided. Lee
Patten will update of signatories for RCL accounts.

Bell Tower Requests: Bell Tower Committee approved \$960 request from E-Team for custom coffee mugs. Mugs were given to new members and are also available for purchase.

Pastor's and Joint Ministries report: Pastor Beth will be out of the office on continuing education and vacation, starting tomorrow. Pentecost picnic and LSI garden blessing went well. VBS begins June 26.

#### **Highlights from the Boards:**

Worship & Music - Congregational Life: W & M met today and discussed recent very low attendance at 5:00 pm service. The service will be suspended for the summer, and W & M will reevaluate in the fall at an open meeting. On-line service is generally well-attended and will remain in the long-term.

#### **Old Business**:

**Time & Talent:** Forms are still available and welcome.

**Vacuum:** Council recommends to Property Board that new equipment options be pursued.

**Phones:** Some progress has been made with phone service. Staff can effectively answer the phones and make long distance calls. The caller will still

typically hear at least three rings, plus another five rings prior to voice mail access, so some issue with callers giving up too soon. Another vendor has approached, with potential upgrade of both phone system and building internet coverage. Pastor Beth will ask Jon Bellis to review and advise.

Summerfest Parking: Council deferred all action regarding public parking on RLC property to Property Board. E-Team and Social Ministry are planning Pie Social on Saturday July 9, following Summerfest parade.

#### **New Business:**

**Staff Handbook:** Personnel Committee will meet to review updates before presenting for Council consideration.

**Board Reorganization:** President Cullen Stevens suggested that RCL review and consider redefinition and re-alignment of Boards. Pastor Beth is planning quarterly Board nights to support cross-coordination, with all Boards attending a joint opening and holding their meetings on the same night, beginning in fall 2022.

## **Congregational Read**

Ready, set, read! Aside from the Bible, the single most referenced book in my ministry has been *Disunity in Christ, by Christena Cleveland. Will you read it with me this summer and join in a conversation on what we've read on August 7?* 

About the book: despite Jesus' prayer that all Christians "be one," divisions have been epidemic in the body of Christ from the beginning to the present. We cluster in theological groups, gender groups, age

groups, ethnic groups, educational and economic groups. We criticize freely those who disagree with us, don't look like us, don't act like us and don't even like what we like.

Though we may think we know why this happens, Christena Cleveland says we probably don't. In this eye-opening book, learn the hidden reasons behind conflict and divisions. There are books available to purchase in the church office. Books are \$12/each.

#### Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America

I was privileged to attend as a delegate for RLC for the 34th Annual Gathering/Convention of SE Ia. Women's Organization. It was held on June 10-11, 2022 at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Davenport, Iowa. The theme was 'Called to be Women in Mission", and the Bible verse was 2 Corinthians 5:20. So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us. On Friday, we heard, Susan Marty present program, Madison Marketplace that St. Paul church helps support.

It started at Madison Elementary School which is located a cross the street from the church. This schoolis in a low income, poverty, area. So, the program is trying to provide nutritious fresh food, especially fruits & veggies.

They also mentor, tutor, and help Madison students & staff. We also heard about another program, Tapestry Farms, by Ann McGlynn, director. It is a nonprofit urban farm system that invests in refugees who live in the Quad Cities. They have one garden at the church grounds, and several others in the area. The families plant their gardens, take some for their own use, & sell the rest to supplement their income. This program also helps the refugees get settled in housing, helping getting social security cards, photo ID, medical cards, and setting up for any other programs.

They teach the refugees how to navigate the bus system, how to get & help shop for groceries, and registering for school. We collected love gifts for the Tapestry Farms, gift cards to Walmart/Aldi's, soap, toilet paper, paper towels, dish soap, laundry soap, and lotion.

We had another presentation by Chris Nelson, music director at St. Paul, and college organist and instructor at Augusta College. He did an organ demonstration, hymn sing and a piece of music that he composed. Friday evening ended with vespers of Holden Prayer.

Saturday started with opening worship and a Bible Study with Pastor Sara Olson-Smith. We received greetings by Churchwide Women of the ELCA, and Southeastern Iowa. Synod Bishop Amy Current.

At our business meeting we elected a new vice president, Glory Reynolds; treasurer, Dianne Sickler; and board members, Teresa Ziegenmeyer, Kris Elgin, Heidi Hotveldt, Julie Leeper; nominating committee, Sue Mangels, Virginia Eggers, Ardy Proehl; Triennial delegates, Roberta Jurgersen, Sue Mangels, Dianne Stricker, & alternate, Judy Munger.

The Gathering offerings of total as of June 11 was \$2,677. Donations can still be sent until July 31. One half will to the Churchwide Women's Organization, one quarter to Tapestry Farms, one quarter to Madison Market.

Next years 35th Gathering/Convention will be held at Stoney Creek Hotel, Johnston, Iowa on June 9-10, 2023. Theme of "Serving the Lord'. That is real close so maybe we can have people from RLC attend. Be on the lookout for an upcoming survey concerns RLC WELCA. We look forward to your response.




#### Vacation Bible School
